

Troop 90 COVID-19 Code of Conduct

While we are under restrictions due to the pandemic, Troop 90 will modify our in-person events to adhere to new social distancing and cleanliness protocols as well as executive orders regarding gathering sizes both inside and outside. Troop 90 intends to conduct in-person activities which include but are not limited to:

- Troop Meetings
- Camping Trips
- Special single day workshops such as a Totin' Chip class

Due to supervision challenges, patrol meetings will remain virtual. All Scouts and adults will continue to abide by **the BSA's Guide to Safe Scouting** in addition to the protocols below.

The Code of Conduct is as follows:

- Each scout will wear a mask at all times during in-person Scouting activities. Removal of masks can occur for eating and drinking, but only when a minimum of a 6 foot distance is maintained between individuals. Think of two blood circles' distance away.
- If a scout touches his face, nose or eyes, he is required to wash/sanitize their hands at the sanitization stations provided at each in-person event.
- If a scout is not feeling well in any way, they are not permitted to participate in any in-person Scouting event. Such an incident must be reported to the Scoutmaster so that additional safety protocols may be executed, if necessary.
- If a scout is in close contact with a known COVID-19 infected person, the scout must stay away from in-person scouting activities for two weeks. Such an incident must be reported to the Scoutmaster so that additional safety protocols may be executed, if necessary.
- If a scout is in close contact with person who recently travelled to/from a state on the New Jersey Travel Advisory list (<https://covid19.nj.gov/faqs/nj-information/travel-and-transportation/which-states-are-on-the-travel-advisory-list-are-there-travel-restrictions-to-or-from-new-jersey>) or someone who has travelled internationally for a period in excess of 24 hours, the scout must stay away from in-person scouting activities for two weeks. Such an incident must be reported to the Scoutmaster.
- On camping trips, scouts will be sleeping in tents alone unless they have a sibling on the trip (or a hammock). Scouts cannot attend camping trips if they are apprehensive in any way with sleeping in a tent by themselves in the woods.
- On camping trips, scouts will be following strict guidelines with regards to safe food preparation, eating and cleaning.
- Scouts will recognize we are only as safe as our weakest link and will report non-compliance of others to an adult or senior scout.

_____ Non-compliance with any of the above Code will result in the Scout being asked to leave the Scouting event and may require exclusion from future in-person events. Parents will be called to pick up their son (Please acknowledge by initialing)
